EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Board of Governors’ Policy #124 ‘Naming’ establishes policies and procedures for approving names for campus facilities. The President forwards Class 1 facility naming recommendations from the Naming Committee to the Board of Governors for approval. This report conveys the recommendations of the May 18, 2017 meeting of the Naming Committee for Board approval.

DESCRIPTION & RATIONALE

The Naming Committee may recommend that a facility be named to reflect its use, to honour someone associated with the University, or to recognize a donor.

On May 18, 2017, the Naming Committee considered the following Class 1 Facility request by the Development office as recognition of a donor:

- a) UBC Baseball Tourmaline Rose Indoor Training Centre, part of the larger UBC Baseball Stadium project. The building houses 4 batting cages, 2 pitching mounds, including motion capture and video analysis camera equipment for research purposes.

The Naming Committee also considered a request for the re-naming of the building formally named the Student Union Building to represent its purpose.

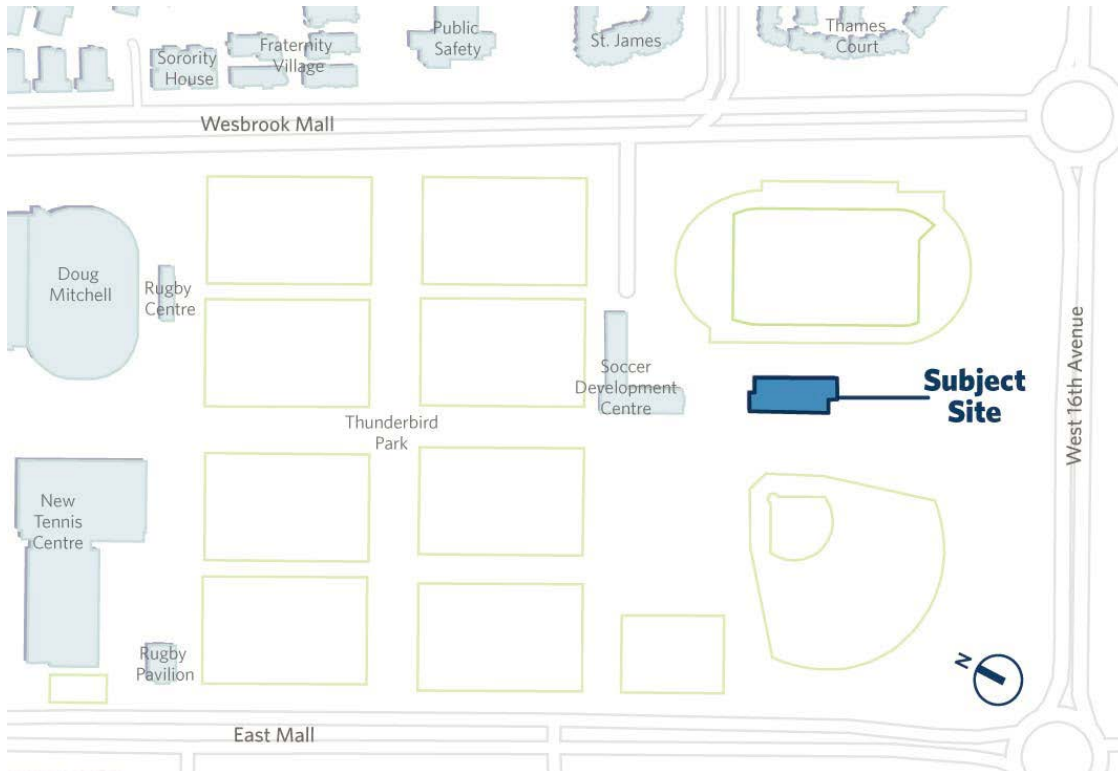
- b) UBC Life Building, the renewed building which will open with Phase 1 of the UBC Life program, including swing space for needed academic space renovations on the third floor, and a student and community program on the main and basement floors.

Finally, the Naming Committee considered requests to clarify building identification within the following groups of buildings:

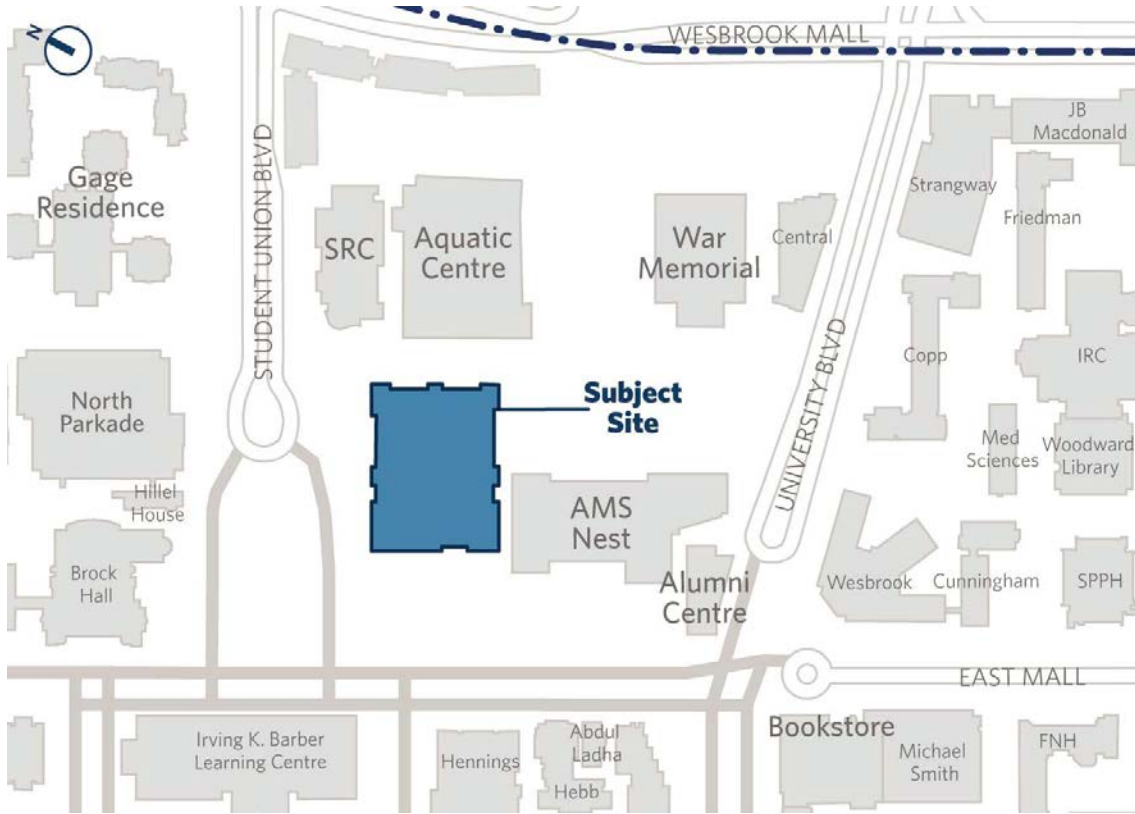
- c) Totem Park Residence, the Fire Department has proposed that each building within this residence be numbered to add clarity to communications in the case of emergency response.
- d) Ponderosa Commons, while the mix of residential with institutional uses has been successful, this presents some challenges to effective wayfinding. It is recommended to formalize the common practice of referring to the three buildings which comprise Ponderosa Commons as East, North and West.

The naming committee approved these naming requests and recommended that the President refer their recommendations to the Board of Governors for approval.

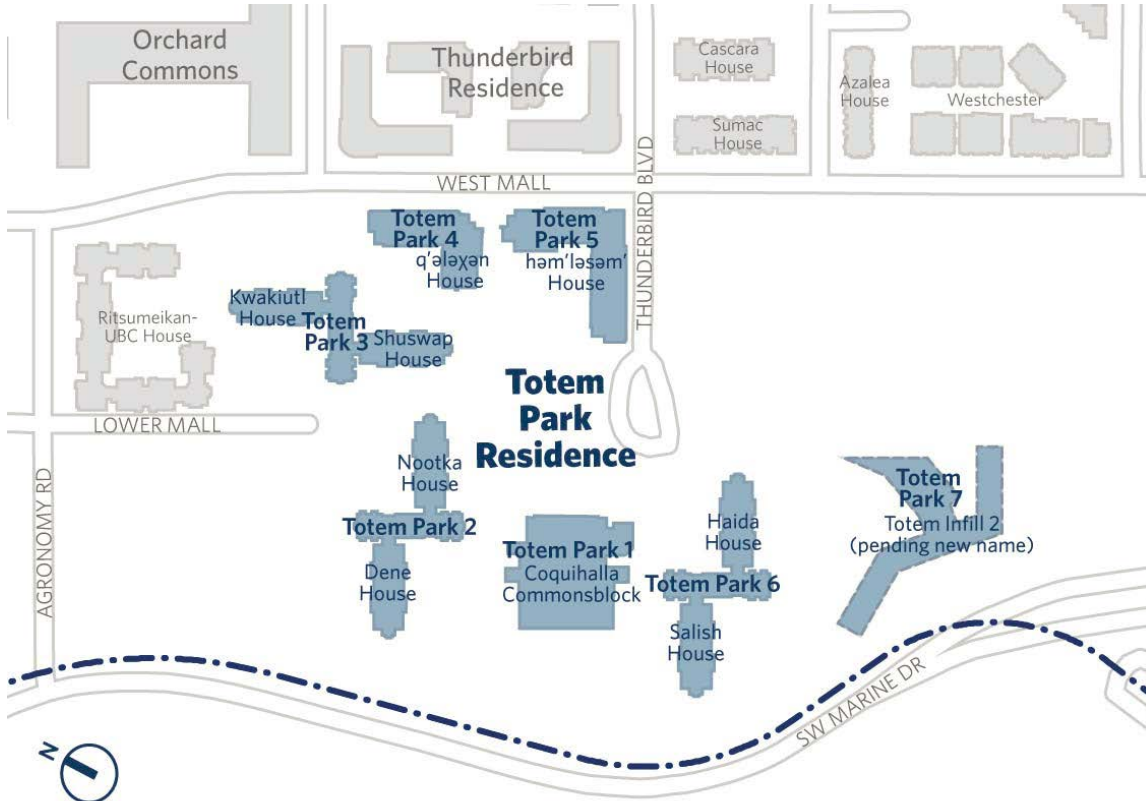
Map a) **UBC Baseball Tourmaline Rose Indoor Training Centre**
