Engagement numbers continue to be very strong, with 52,633 alumni getting involved with UBC to the end of 2017.

#### JOURNEY TO EMINENCE: ALUMNI UBC 100 HONG KONG GALA & AWARDS

On December 9, nearly 350 alumni and friends attended an inspiring gala and awards ceremony in Hong Kong. The evening celebrated the strength of our global alumni community as well as the long-term service and significant contributions of individual alumni in building the *alumni UBC* community in Asia, particularly in Hong Kong.

The event included a pre-reception to recognize the 13 Asia-based recipients of our Alumni Builder Awards, created exclusively to commemorate the 100th anniversary of *alumni UBC*. A committee of alumni peers selected six of the builders for special secondary awards in the categories of Innovation, Entrepreneurship, Arts & Humanities and Sciences & Social Sciences, which were awarded during the gala dinner.

The *alumni UBC* Hong Kong Leadership Council was instrumental in planning this year's gala event, contributing countless planning hours and raising HKD 700,000 (approx. CAD 115,000) in sponsorship funds.


#### THE HUNDRED-YEAR TREK

In partnership with the AMS, alumni UBC hosted a book launch for The Hundred-Year Trek: A History of Student Life at UBC and acknowledged some of the key players and personalities who have built UBC community and culture over the past century. One hundred and twenty-five alumni and friends attended. The book's author, Sheldon Goldfarb, PhD'92, MAS'96, AMS archivist, was the keynote speaker, and Justin McElroy, BA'11, CBC reporter and past editor of the Ubyssey, was moderator for a panel discussion. The panel included Dave Frank, BSc'83, MBA'85, chair of the Richmond Community Foundation, former AMS president and past member of the UBC Board of Governors; **Sophia Haque**, *BCom'07*, Studentcare program manager and former VP-Finance for the AMS: Nestor Korchinsky. the face of UBC intramurals for four decades; and Ava Nasiri, BA'16, former AMS president and VP-Admin. The evening was a reunion of the "hacks," and there was representation from at least four decades of the student executive.

### MASTER MIND MASTER CLASS: WITH ATOM EGOYAN

*alumni UBC*'s Master Mind Master Class series offers an unprecedented look into the minds of modern thinkers making a unique impact on the world, and the lessons they've learned. To honour the 50th anniversary of film classes at UBC, *alumni UBC* partnered with the Department of Theatre and Film, Faculty of Arts and UBC Library to host filmmaker **Atom Egoyan**. More than 350 alumni and friends attended.

Egoyan is the director of modern classics such as *Exotica*, the Oscarnominated *The Sweet Hereafter*, *Ararat*, and *Chloe*. He shared with the audience how he makes stories compelling and why bold filmmaking has never been more important than it is in the current global political climate. Prior to the main event, Egoyan conducted a master class with 100 film students.

### GREAT TREKKER SERIES: WITH BEN HEPPNER, BMUS'79, LLD'97

On October 30, *alumni UBC* presented its annual Great Trekker event at the TIFF Bell Lightbox in Toronto. This program provides UBC grads with exclusive opportunities to meet and hear from prominent alumni and build connections within their local alumni community. This year's special guest was renowned Canadian tenor and CBC Broadcaster **Ben Heppner**, BMus'79, LLD'97.

The evening began with a mini-mentoring session hosted by Dr. Heppner, where four alumni had the opportunity to ask him questions in an informal environment. At the same time, **Barbara Miles**, VP, Development & Alumni Engagement, hosted a recognition reception for more than 50 UBC donors and their guests.

Afterwards, the 85 alumni and friends in attendance enjoyed an "in conversation" with Dr. Heppner, who regaled them with entertaining and poignant stories from his personal journey since graduating from UBC, and highlights from his career. The evening concluded with a networking reception, where guests had the opportunity to interact with Dr. Heppner in a more relaxed setting.

#### MINI MED SERIES: CHILDREN'S HEALTH

Raising children to be healthy – physically, cognitively, socially and emotionally – is critical for their development and future well-being. That is why it was so important to dedicate this year's Mini-Med series to children's health.

More than 100 alumni and community members attended the four Mini-Med presentations, which took place from October 18 to November 8 at the Clinical Campus at Kelowna General Hospital. Medical experts from the Okanagan and the lower mainland provided parents, grandparents, teachers and caregivers with the information they need to raise kids to be healthy and happy.

### THE ACTIVE LIFE: WHAT ARE THE RISKS AND REWARDS?

On November 8, *alumni UBC* collaborated with the Faculty of Medicine to present a panel discussion in Victoria on the risks and rewards of leading an active life. More than 50 alumni and friends, UBC students and medical residents listened to a panel of UBC and community experts discuss how sedentary lifestyles and fear of serious injury can act as barriers to reaping the rewards of a physically active lifestyle in adults and opportunities for outdoor risky play in kids.

The evening included a pre-talk for UBC students and medical residents featuring a number of local specialists sharing their expertise in concussion treatment. It helped build awareness of *alumni UBC*'s regional programming with the next generation of UBC alumni.



#### SCOTIABANK ECONOMIC FORUM

More than 300 alumni and friends attended the 2017 Scotiabank Forum held at Scotiabank Theatre in early November. This is the fourth year *alumni UBC*, in partnership with the Sauder School of Business, has collaborated on the morning event with Scotiabank's senior economist **Jean-François Perrault**.

Following a light breakfast networking reception, attendees listened to Perrault's observations on the Canadian and World economies. With continued growth and generally low interest rates, the outlook is fairly positive, he reported, but he also warned that current geopolitical risks could derail what looks like a solid global recovery.

#### FALL GRADUATION

*alumni UBC* celebrated fall graduation by welcoming more than 5,100 guests and 1,025 new alumni to celebratory receptions held at the Robert H. Lee Alumni Centre. This is a 190 per cent increase in general attendance over last year and a 253 per cent increase in engaged alumni.

One reason for the increase was our partnership with the Ceremonies and Events Office, who moved their celebratory elements from the Flag Pole Plaza to the centre for a more concentrated joint effort. New grads returned their gowns to the nearby Bookstore, which also helped boost numbers.

Sixteen alumni reps from various faculties volunteered at the graduation ceremonies, where all new grads received an alumni handbook, and we benefited from the support of a further 30 volunteers, both students and alumni, for the receptions.

*alumni UBC* provided complimentary sparkling wine in a branded flute to each new grad, and complimentary coffee and tea to all attendees. Guests made the most of the centre's interactive wall, professional photographers, cake, merchandise, and live performances from the School of Music.

A-Card activations saw an 86 per cent increase over last fall, with 1,149 completed online or in person. Our enhanced interaction areas for sponsors were visited by more than 703 alumni, with BMO filling out 100 applications on site.



#### **Career Strategy Sessions**

This quarter we piloted a new initiative for UBC alumni called Career Strategy Sessions. Provided both in person and online, the sessions provide an action-oriented career exploration opportunity specific to each individual. They help alumni gain insight about their skills, strengths, and values, and how to leverage them to design a meaningful and fulfilling career.

For the pilot, we offered the sessions once a week and this quarter were able to deliver 47 sessions. All participants reported that the sessions were beneficial to their career development and met or exceeded their expectations.

#### How to Write a Professional Bio

This live webinar, hosted by *alumni UBC*'s career educator **Michele Murphy**, took alumni through a step-by-step process for creating a professional bio. It was accessed by 222 alumni.

#### How to Effectively Find and Engage with a Professional Mentor

This live webinar marked our first partnership with e@UBC, the entrepreneurship hub housed on the lower level of the Robert H. Lee Alumni Centre. Alumna and accomplished entrepreneur **Amielle Lake**, *BA'02*, led this engaging session about how to find a mentor and effectively manage a mentoring relationship. This live online event was accessed by 116 alumni, who contributed to a lively Q&A session at the end.

#### How to Tell a Story That Sells

This workshop, a collaboration between *alumni UBC* and UBC Sauder, brought 68 alumni to the Robson Square campus for some powerful public speaking tips. Guest presenter Ivan Ruis energized the group with a series of interactive activities. Feedback was very positive.

#### GOAL 2 | DEEPER ENGAGEMENT

Deepen connection with key alumni, so UBC benefits from their voice, influence, skills and capacity.

#### PRESIDENTIAL INTRODUCTION IN CALGARY

On October 5, *alumni UBC* introduced **Professor Ono** to the alumni community in Calgary with a series of evening activities held at the Fairmont Palliser.

**Gregg Saretsky**, *BSc'82*, *MBA'84* (WestJet president and CEO; vice chair, *alumni UBC* Board of Directors), and **Randy Findlay**, *BASc'73* (*alumni UBC* Board of Directors and *alumni UBC* Calgary Leadership Committee), co-hosted a roundtable for Professor Ono and 12 key members of UBC's alumni community in Calgary. Following this discussion, Professor Ono hosted a recognition reception for more than 35 UBC donors and guests.

During the evening program, Professor Ono spoke of his priorities for UBC before moderating a panel discussion with local and UBC experts. The panel discussed the unique challenges and opportunities Canada faces in nurturing its innovation ecosystem, as well as new initiatives that are putting Canada on track to become an innovation powerhouse. After leading an audience Q&A, he concluded the program and invited the nearly 140 alumni, donors, UBC co-op students, and community members to enjoy a post-program reception.

#### LIVING WITH PURPOSE: IDEAS FOR PURSUING A LIFE OF MEANING

For this panel discussion moderated by CBC's **Margaret Gallagher**, *alumni UBC* partnered with the Project Change Foundation (PCF), which is led by four UBC alumni who embrace and promote positive change in the world. **Joe Kelly**, *BSc'94*, *MSc'96*, and **Holman Wang**, *BEd(Elem)'95*, *MASA'98*, *LLB'05*, convened four world-class thought leaders in human well-being and fulfillment to explore the topic of living with purpose.

**Eyoälha Baker, Dr. John Helliwell, Rev. Beth Hayward** and **Azim Jamal** engaged in an insightful conversation on how they understand, seek and find meaning in life, and how our alumni can do the same. After the discussion, members of PCF and past and present PCF grant recipients hosted a reception and silent auction that generated \$10,000 for emerging change-and-difference makers. This year's recipient is the Binners' Project, a Downtown Eastside initiative supported by UBC students, staff and alumni. Previous recipients include The Lipstick Project and Community First Foundation.

More than 225 alumni and friends attended the panel discussion and fundraising reception.





#### DESIGN YOUR LIFE: STUDENT EDITION

*alumni UBC* was approached by students in the Sauder School of Business Bachelor + Masters of Management cohort for resources on personal growth and finance to help them transition into life after graduation. To establish a new entry point for alumni engagement, *alumni UBC* designed a pilot workshop in collaboration with the B+MM cohort.

The workshop was delivered through a two-pronged approach: the first was on mapping your personal network and was led by **Dr. Neil Armitage**, a learning strategist with UBC's Centre of Student Involvement and Careers and professor in UBC's sociology department. The second was led by alumna Karen So, the soon-to-be UBC Campus TD Branch Manager, as part of the TD Bank's financial literacy outreach program. Thirty students from the B+MM cohort attended the two-hour workshop, which took place at the Robert H. Lee Alumni Centre.

#### ROBERT H. LEE ALUMNI CENTRE AND UBC WELCOME CENTRE

The Robert H. Lee Alumni Centre hosted 116 meetings, conferences and events this quarter, with a total of 1,570 reserved hours. Highlights include the awards ceremony for the Dhahan Prize for Punjabi Literature, the 2017 Symposium for the Canadian Undergraduate Surgical Education Committee and an anniversary symposium to mark 20 Years of Brain Health held by by the Djavad Mowafaghian Centre.

The Welcome Centre continues to establish itself as a favourite spot for community connections on campus. For the second year, we have transformed the Robert H. Lee Alumni Centre into "Holiday Central" with 20 Christmas trees decorated by different faculties and departments. To be eligible to vote for their favourite tree, patrons donated food or money to the food bank. The program launched with the second annual Cocktails and Carols, which attracted 200 guests.

The aim is to create a warm and welcoming gathering space for the community and also to promote the Robert H. Lee Alumni Centre as a great choice of venue for holiday parties.

The centre's Tunes at Noon program, which offers free performances by school of music students in the foyer, has developed a strong following and continues to see growth.

The Campus Challenge, which encourages students, staff and faculty to explore their campus and win prizes, ran for a second year and enjoyed double the participation rate of last year.

Fall graduation was also a great success with a significant increase in both guests and activities as described earlier.

#### OKANAGAN CAMPUS ALUMNI AND VOLUNTEER LUNCHEON: IT'S THE MOST WONDERFUL TIME OF THE YEAR!

On Giving Tuesday, we thanked our valued campus partners and community volunteers by treating them to lunch. More than 100 guests (including our wonderful *alumni UBC* volunteers) enjoyed a buffet of winter comfort foods along with hot chocolate and waffle s'mores.


