EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The dual degree Master of Architecture (M.Arch.) and Master of Landscape Architecture (M.L.A.) is a four-year program offered by the School of Architecture and Landscape Architecture. The program was approved by the Board of Governors in April 2014.

The School has been accepting students to the dual degree program with one year’s advanced placement, but there is currently no mechanism in place to adjust the tuition for this group of students. It is proposed that the required minimum number of instalments for advanced placement students be reduced from 12 instalments (for four years) to nine instalments (for three years).

DESCRIPTION & RATIONALE The dual degree Master of Architecture (M.Arch.) and Master of Landscape Architecture (M.L.A.) is a four-year program offered by the School of Architecture and Landscape Architecture. The program was approved by the Board of Governors in April 2014, with the first intake of students occurring in 2016W.

Since the dual degree program’s inception, the School has admitted three students with one year’s advanced placement, which enables the students to complete the degree requirements in three years, rather than four.

There is currently no mechanism in place to adjust tuition for this group of students. The School proposes to reduce the required minimum number of instalments for this group of students from 12 instalments (for four years) to nine instalments (for three years). This proposal was discussed and recommended at the faculty level, at a meeting on March 6, 2018.

If approved by the Board of Governors, the adjustment would allow the School to continue its practice of offering selected applicants admission with up to one year’s advanced placement, and would reflect the reduced degree requirements in the tuition assessment.
