PRIOR SUBMISSIONS

The subject matter of this submission has not previously been considered by the Finance Committee.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The President approved a recommendation that allows the Bachelor of Dental Science program in Dental Hygiene to collect non-refundable acceptance deposits of:

- \$500 for domestic students accepting offers for the Degree Completion options (1-2 years) of the BDSc program in Dental Hygiene (where applicant holds a Dental Hygiene Diploma)
- \$1,000 for international students accepting offers for the Degree Completion options (1-2 years) of the BDSc program in Dental Hygiene (where applicant holds a Dental Hygiene Diploma)
- \$1,000 for domestic and international students accepting offers for the Bachelor Degree Entry-to-Practice (ETP) option of the BDSc program in Dental Hygiene

These deposits would be effective for the 2023-2024 Winter Session Term 1 intake (September 2023).

Acceptance deposits are credited toward the first tuition instalment, and forfeited by students who accept an offer of admission and then fail to register or decline the offer after the fact, unless there are extenuating circumstances.

The non-refundable acceptance deposit for the Bachelor of Dental Science (BDSc) Program in Dental Hygiene is currently \$300. I am recommending that the President approve increased non-refundable acceptance deposits of:

- \$500 for domestic students accepting offers for the Degree Completion options (1-2 years) of the BDSc program in Dental Hygiene (where applicant holds a Dental Hygiene Diploma)
- \$1,000 for international students accepting offers for the Degree Completion options (1-2 years) of the BDSc program in Dental Hygiene (where applicant holds a Dental Hygiene Diploma)
- \$1,000 for domestic and international students accepting offers for the Bachelor Degree Entry-to-Practice (ETP) option of the BDSc program in Dental Hygiene

These deposits would be effective 2023/24 Winter Session, Term 1 (i.e., September 2023). Non-refundable deposits are levied when students accept an offer of admission; the deposits are applied to students' first tuition instalments.

RATIONALE

The purpose of the increase for Degree Completion non-refundable acceptance deposits is to align with other undergraduate programs at UBC.

The purpose of the increase for Entry-to-Practice non-refundable acceptance deposits is to reduce the number of drop-outs, which affect the class size, and at late dates significantly reduce the availability of waitlisted students. This is a professional program competing with other professional health programs.

A consultation was undertaken with the AMS, by the VP Students Office, between January 16, 2023 and February 15, 2023. A copy of the consultation report is attached.

STUDENT TUITION FEE DEPOSIT CHANGES CONSULTATION REPORT

The Vice-President, Students Office, in partnership with the Faculty of Dentistry, conducted a student consultation regarding the acceptance deposit for their Dental Hygiene Degree Program. This report outlines the consultation process and summarizes student feedback including the student representatives' submission verbatim in Appendix 2.

Mode of Consultation

The consultation consisted of an e-consultation. PROGRAM OVERVIEW

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The BDSc program in Dental Hygiene is offered as:

- a 4-year Bachelor Degree Entry-to-Practice (ETP)
- a 1-year Degree Completion (DC); applicant holds a Dental Hygiene Diploma
- a 2-year Degree Completion (DC); applicant holds a Dental Hygiene Diploma

Admission to the Degree Completion option (DC 1 or 2-year program) is based on number of postsecondary credits the applicant has. The DC 1 is the entry point for individuals who receive three years or 30 credits of specified university transferable courses. DC 2 is the entry point for individuals who receive academic credit for two years of previous post-secondary education.

PROPOSED TUITION, FEE, OR DEPOSIT CHANGE

ETP acceptance non-refundable deposit change to \$1,000.

DC acceptance non-refundable deposit change to \$500 for domestic students and \$1,000 for international students. This would be for both DC 1 and DC 2 options.

Non-refundable deposits are applied to the student's tuition once they enter the program.

PROPOSED TUITION, FEE, OR DEPOSIT RATIONALE

The ETP deposit increase to \$1,000 in order to reduce the number of drop-outs, which affect the class size, and at late dates significantly reduce the availability of the waitlisted. This is a professional program competing with other professional health programs (midwifery, nursing, etc).

The DC deposit increase is to match the UBC's new student deposit of \$500 for domestic students and \$1,000 for international students.
