EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the Okanagan Nation Alliance (ONA) and UBC Okanagan has been renewed. This MoU, first established in 2005, highlights the importance of higher education for Indigenous People of the Southern Interior and acknowledges respect for Indigenous Peoples and their lands. Under this agreement, various academic programs, research initiatives, and partnerships have been established, including the Indigenous Studies Program and Syilx knowledge classes. The MoU has facilitated collaborations with Syilx communities in different disciplines, such as campus planning and events. Both UBC Okanagan and the ONA value this relationship, recognizing the educational and research opportunities it brings for long-term community prosperity. In conclusion, this renewal emphasizes the significance of the MoU in fostering a strong and mutually beneficial partnership, making notable contributions to research, learning, and community engagement.
